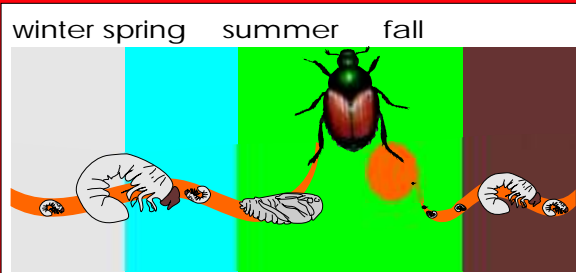


Japanese beetle is a colorful, shiny, metallic-green, ½ inch-long insect that damages many plants. The adult beetles feed on over 400 plants, attacking flower buds and fruit. They prefer American linden, apple, maples, rose, crape myrtle, pin oak, birch and plum. The grubs will also feed on a wide variety of plant roots including ornamental trees and shrubs, gardens and turfgrasses such as Kentucky bluegrass, perennial ryegrass, tall fescues and bentgrass. The grubs kill the turf in irregular patches. The grub stage lives underground 10 months of the year eating plant and grass roots. Beetles hibernate as grubs underground in winter and starts damaging roots in spring. If your lawn has brown or dead patches, dig up some of the turf to find the white, curled grubs. The grubs pupate in late spring, and adult beetles emerge late spring or early summer. Adult female beetles destroy nearby plants. They eat, burrow into the ground, lay a few eggs and return to eat, repeating the cycle until 40 to 60 eggs have been laid.

Adult beetles can fly long distances, so those caught in your yard may have come from up to a mile away. Under favorable conditions, a trap will capture only about 75 percent of the beetles that approach it. Some traps attract more beetles than they capture so do not put traps near your garden or your favorite plants. Put traps at the borders of your property, away from plants the beetles may damage. Traps are most effective when many of them are spread over an entire community.

Trap placement should be timed to coincide with the emergence of adult Japanese beetles in your area. Adults generally emerge between early June and late August. Check with your extension agent for information of the Japanese beetle flight period in your area.



EASY INSTRUCTIONS

Assemble vanes as shown. They only go together one way! Attach hanger to trap.

USE GLOVES WHEN HANDLING LURE. Open lure pouch, remove lid from lure tube and slide lure in hole in vane as shown. Use

with Oak Stump Farms **JAPANESE BEETLE LURE** or any other brand of Japanese Beetle Lure. Use new lures every season.

Hang trap 3 to 6 feet above the ground. Place traps about 30 feet downwind from foliage to intercept beetles. **DO NOT PLACE**

NEAR FOLIAGE. Set traps out before daily temperatures exceed 70F, and remove at the end of the season. Keep drain holes cleared and empty trap at least weekly or when full. Use at least one trap per 5,000 square feet. **USE CAUTION WHEN EMPTYING TRAPS CONTAINING LIVE INSECTS.**

Put full bags into a pail of soapy water to drown live insects. Place dead beetles and bags in compost. **BAG & TRAP ARE FULLY BIODEGRADABLE AND COMPOSTABLE!**

HANG TRAPS OUT OF REACH OF CHILDREN AND PETS.



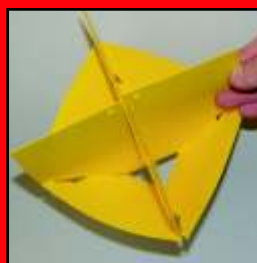
Slide Vanes
